### Cinnamon-Applesauce Ornaments

- 1 cup cinnamon
- 1 cup applesauce
- 1 tablespoon white glue

rolling pin cookie cutters straw or chopstick ribbon parchment paper cookie sheet



Mix ingredients in a large bowl. Form the dough into a ball. Roll out the dough on parchment paper to 1/4" thickness. Press out shapes with cookie cutters. Poke a hole in the tops of ornament with straw or chopstick. Let air dry for several days or bake in a 200 degree oven (flip ornament every 10 minutes CAREFULLY). Thread ribbon and hang on your tree. These ornaments keep for decades and smell wonderful!
